a) Bachelor of Honors Applied Arts (B.H.A.A.)

This improves the culture of man and leads to develop the healthy society and helps to purify the mind and soul and helps to uphold the glory of Indian art and culture.

D.M.S.S. has the credit of starting the 4 years Bachelor course in Bachelor of Honors Applied Arts (BHAA) from 2017-18. There is a great need and demand for learning Applied Arts by large number of Art lovers.

In this context D.M.S.S has comeout with a revolutionary idea of creating a new platform for Art lovers to study and visualize not only the ancient Art but also the modern art under the changing circumstances.

II Regulations for 4 years Bachelor of Honors Applied Arts:-

Proposed Regulations for 4-Years Integrated Under Graduate Semester based Course Leading to the Bachelor Honors Degree in Applied Arts (BHAA)

1. NAME OF THE COURSE AND DURATION OF THE COURSE.

The Course proposed hereunder shall be called as Bachelor Honors Degree in Applied Arts (BHAA in short form) and shall be spread over a period of four years divided into eight semesters, each semester being a period of 16 weeks.

NOTE:

- **a.** These regulations are applicable to students taking admission to I semester BHAA from academic year 2017 18.
- b. Each semester shall extend over a minimum period of SIXTEEN weeks teaching duration.
- **c.** The duration of the course shall be four years consisting of 08 semesters.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

a. Students who have passed Pre-University Examination (10+2) or equivalent examination in any discipline are eligible to apply.

3. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- a At the time of admission all documents in original in support of the claims made in the application have to be produced along with the Transfer Certificate from the Institution last attended.
- b All decisions taken by the University with regard to the course and any other matter not mentioned here are final and the candidates are bound to abide by them.

4. SCHEME OF INSTRUCTIONS:

There shall be compulsory theory and Practical papers as mentioned in the scheme of examination.

5. TEACHING SCHEDULE:

There shall be Practical and Theory class. The duration of teaching hours vary between 2-6 hours per subject per week. (For details see Scheme of Examination)

6. ATTENDANCE:

- a. Each semester shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance and a student shall be considered to have put in the required attendance for that semester if the candidate has attended not less than 75% of the number of working days (lectures and practical classes during each semester)
- b. Candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance shall not be eligible to take the examination of the concerned semester.
- c. A candidate who fails to satisfy the requirement of attendance in a semester shall re-join the same semester by obtaining prior permission from the University. (There will be no supplementary exam in practical papers)

7. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction shall be English/Kannada. Students are allowed to write the examination in English/Kannada.

8. THERE SHALL BE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION HELD AFTER THE COMPLETION OF EVERY SEMESTAR.

9. APPEARANCE FOR THE EXAMINATION:

A candidate shall apply for all the papers of a semester when he appears for examination of each semester for the first time.

10. BREAK-UP OF MARKS FOR THEORY AND PRACTICAL COURSES/PAPERS:

Each theory paper / course shall comprise of 100 marks for semester of which 80 marks for examination and 20 marks for internal assessment. All practical papers comprise of 100 marks for semester of which 60 marks for examination and 40 marks for internal assessment. (See Scheme of Examination)

11. SETTING OF QUESTION PAPERS AND METHOD OF VALUATION

- **a.** All theory papers will be set and valued by the University as per the rules and regulations of the university.
- b. The panel of juries appointed by the university(BOE) shall do all the work pertaining to the practical examination. All the question papers for the practical subjects will be set by the Internal juries on the day of examination appointed by the BOE. The practical papers will be evaluated by the internal and external juries appointed by the BOE, at the collage premises.
- c. Panel of juries shall consist of teachers of the institution drawn from different subjects and external experts covering as for as possible all those subjects for which there are candidates.

12. MINIMUM FOR A PASS AND PROMOTION OF THE CANDIDATE TO THE SUCCEEDING SEMESTER:

Minimum for a pass in each paper shall be 35% marks for all the theory papers and 50% for all the practical papers. in the semester put together, the <u>average shall be 50%.</u> ????

13. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATE:

Gradation of results shall be as per the University regulations.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

Internal assessment shall include test, assignments for theory subjects and the practical papers will be assessed by the submission of finished works as mentioned in the scheme of examination.

14. PROVISION FOR REPEATERS:

A candidate is allowed to carry all the previous un-cleared Theory paper/s to the subsequent semester/s. A candidate who fails to get the minimum marks in the internal assessment in practical subjects is not eligible to appear for the annual examination and shall re-join the same semester by obtaining prior permission from the University. If the candidate is not cleared his previous practical papers shall re-join the same semester by obtaining prior permission from the University. (There will be no supplementary exam in practical papers) ????

The candidate shall take the examination as per the syllabus and scheme of examination in force during the subsequent appearances.

Any other issue not envisaged above, shall be resolved by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with the appropriate bodies of the University which shall be final and binding. Wherever the regulation is silent, the provisions of University regulations shall be applicable.

(B) <u>Bachelor of Professional Studies:- (B.P.S)</u>

I Importance:-

The traditional commerce & Management education in India has become irrelevant in the new Era of globalisahion. With trade and commerce assuming innovative dimensions in the context of growing international business, the curricula for commerce faculty should be adapted and re structured to meet the future challenges of all sectors.

The above calls for a Professional approach which can be brought about by professionally run Institutions, keeping in view the need based professional approach for Commerce & management courses.DMSS has come out with a 3 years degree specialized course "Bachelor in Professional studies". The students who offer this course will become a professional student after completion of the course. This professional course will pave the way for higher studies as well as professionally skilled jobs. The major thrust areas are Marketing, Accounting & Taxation and computer graphics, Digital Animation, web designing and Animation.

II Regulations for 3 years bachelor professional studies.

Proposed Regulations for 3-Years Under Graduate Semester based Course Leading to the Bachelor Degree of Professional Studies (B P S)

1.0 NAME OF THE COURSE AND DURATION OF THE COURSE.

The Course proposed hereunder shall be called as Bachelor of Professional Studies (B P S in its short form) and shall be spread over a period of three (3) years divided into six semesters, each semester being a period of 16 weeks.

NOTE:

- **1.** These regulations are applicable to students taking admission to I semester B.P.S from academic year 2017 18.
- 2. Each semester shall extend over a minimum period of SIXTEEN weeks teaching duration.
- **3.** The duration of the course shall be 3 years consisting of 06 semesters.

2.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. Students who have passed Pre-University Examination (10+2) or equivalent examination in any discipline are eligible to apply.

3.0 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ♦ At the time of admission all documents in original in support of the claims made in the application have to be produced along with the Transfer Certificate from the Institution last attended.
- ♦ All decisions taken by the University with regard to the course and any other matter not mentioned here are final and the candidates are bound to abide by them.

4.0 SCHEME OF INSTRUCTIONS:

There shall be 6 subjects in each semester.

5.0 TEACHING SCHEDULE:

For each subject, there shall be lecture class. The duration of teaching hours vary between 4-6 hours per subject per week.

6.0 SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

All papers of this course shall be set/valued/reviewed by BOE of Professional Studies. The process of setting the question paper and valuation will be looked after by the BOE in Professional Studies.

7.0 ATTENDANCE:

- ♦ Each semester shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance and a student shall be considered to have put in the required attendance for that semester if the candidate has attended not less than 75% of the number of working days (lectures during each semester)
- ♦ A candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance shall not be eligible to take the examination of the concerned semester.
- ♦ A candidate who fails to satisfy the requirement of attendance in a semester shall re-join the same semester by obtaining prior permission from the University.

8.0 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction shall be English. However, students are allowed to write the examination in Kannada.

9.0 APPEARANCE FOR THE EXAMINATION:

A candidate shall apply for all the papers of a semester when he appears for examination of each semester for the first time.

10.0 BOARD OF EXAMINERS, VALUATION:

- ♦ There shall be a Board of Examiners for scrutinizing and approving the question papers and scheme of valuation constituted by the University.
- ♦ There will be single valuation for all the papers.

♦ BREAK-UP OF MARKS FOR THEORY AND PRACTICAL COURSES/PAPERS:

♦ Each theory paper / course shall comprise of 100 marks of which 80 marks are for semester end examination and 20 marks are for internal assessment.

♦ QUESTION PAPER PATTERN

The existing pattern of Question paper shall continue.

Part A will have 40 marks. Four questions are given out of which TWO questions are to be answered each carrying 20 marks.

Part B will have 20 marks. Four questions are given out of which TWO questions are to be answered each carrying 10 marks.

Part C will have 20 marks. Six questions are given out of which FOUR questions are to be answered each carrying 5 marks.

A question may have any number of sub-questions depending on the nature of the subject.

♦ MINIMUM FOR A PASS AND PROMOTION OF THE CANDIDATE TO THE SUCCEEDING SEMESTER:

- ♦ Minimum for a pass in each paper shall be 35%, and marks of all the papers in the semester put together, the average shall be 40%. However, a candidate has to score a minimum of 30% in the semester end examination (written examination) i.e., 24 marks out of 80 marks.
- ♦ There shall be no minimum marks for Internal Assessment.

Classification of successful candidates:

♦ Gradation of results shall be as per the University regulations.

♦ INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

Internal assessment shall include test, assignments and skill development. Students are to be evaluated for internal assessment as follows:

Test – 10 marks, Assignment –5 marks, Skill development – 5 marks.

11.0 PROVISION FOR REPEATERS:

- ♦ A candidate is allowed to carry all the previous un-cleared paper/s to the subsequent semester/s.
- ♦ The candidate shall take the examination as per the syllabus and scheme of examination in force during the subsequent appearances.
- ♦ Any other issue not envisaged above, shall be resolved by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with the appropriate bodies of the University which shall be final and binding. Wherever the regulation is silent, the provisions of University regulations shall be applicable.

(C) Bachelor of temple administration (B TemA) 3 years

1) Importance:- Ever since time immemorial temples Mutts etc, have occupied a centrall place in Hindu society and have played a significant role in bringing the community together. They have also been important Centres of learning commerce, music,dance, & so on. The modern day temples, mutts etc, around the world have started to fulfil a similar promise and have increasingly become important in keeping the community together in an allen land and culture. Along with the increased importance, the problem of increased accountability to devotees, donors & Various other stake holders has risen. This has been compounded by the fact that the temples are mainly run by votunteers who cannot afford to spend too much time on the various

mundane activites within the temple mutts etc. so that they can maintain a suitable work family balance.

The above calls for a person who can be a professional by acquiring a special knowledge of temple administration and can devote much his time in managing temples, mutts & so on.

The D.M.S.S.look initiative in introducing a specialised course on temple administration, & introduced a 3 years Bachelor degree in temple administration. The major thrust areas of study are 1) History& Architecture of temples 2) Economics and management and 3) Religion & Philosophy.

The above course is designed in a holistic way and a unique course which combines the adventages of Vedas and modern temple management.

Proposed Regulations for 3-Years Under Graduate Semester based Course Leading to the Bachelor Degree of Temple Administration (B TemA)

1.0 NAME OF THE COURSE AND DURATION OF THE COURSE.

The Course proposed hereunder shall be called as Bachelor of Temple Administration (B TemA in its short form) and shall be spread over a period of three (3) years divided into six semesters, each semester being a period of 16 weeks.

NOTE:

- **1.** These regulations are applicable to students taking admission to I semester B TemA from academic year 2017 18.
- 2. Each semester shall extend over a minimum period of SIXTEEN weeks teaching duration.
- **3.** The duration of the course shall be 3 years consisting of 06 semesters.

2.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. Students who have passed Pre-University Examination (10+2) or equivalent examination in any discipline are eligible to apply.

3.0 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1 At the time of admission all documents in original in support of the claims made in the application

have to be produced along with the Transfer Certificate from the Institution last attended.

2 All decisions taken by the University with regard to the course and any other matter not mentioned here are final and the candidates are bound to abide by them.

4.0 SCHEME OF INSTRUCTIONS:

There shall be 6 papers in the 1st and 2nd semesters as well as 5th and 6th semesters and 5 in the 3rd and 4th semester.(see Appendix -1)

5.0 TEACHING SCHEDULE:

For each subject, there shall be lecture class. The duration of teaching hours vary between 4-6 hours per subject per week. (see appendix-2)

6.0 SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

All papers of this course shall be set/valued/reviewed by the separate BOE set by the University of Mysore for Bachelor of Temple Administration.

♦ There will be single valuation for all the papers.

7.0 ATTENDANCE:

1 Each semester shall be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating attendance and a student shall be

considered to have put in the required attendance for that semester if the candidate has attended not

less than 75% of the number of working days (lectures during each semester)

- 2 A candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance shall not be eligible to take the examination of the concerned semester.
- 3 A candidate who fails to satisfy the requirement of attendance in a semester shall re-join the same

semester by obtaining prior permission from the University.

8.0 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction shall be English. However, students are allowed to write the examination in Kannada.

9.0 APPEARANCE FOR THE EXAMINATION:

A candidate shall apply for all the papers of a semester when he appears for examination of each semester for the first time.

♦ BREAK-UP OF MARKS FOR THEORY AND PRACTICAL COURSES/PAPERS:

◆ Each theory paper / course shall comprise of 100 marks of which 80 marks are for semester end examination and 20 marks are for internal assessment. (See Appendix-3)

10.0 QUESTION PAPER PATTERN

The existing pattern of Question paper shall continue.

Part A will have 30 marks. Ten questions are given out of which six questions are to be answered each carrying 5 marks.

Part B will have 30 marks. Six questions are given out of which three questions are to be answered each carrying 10 marks.

Part C will have 20 marks. Three questions are given out of which one question is to be answered carrying 10 marks.

A question may have any number of sub-questions depending on the nature of the subject.

10.1 MINIMUM FOR A PASS AND PROMOTION OF THE CANDIDATE TO THE

SUCCEEDING SEMESTER: Minimum for a pass in each paper shall be 35%, and marks of all the papers in the semester put together, the average shall be 40%. However, a candidate has to score a minimum of 35% in the semester end examination (written examination) i.e., 28 marks out of 80 marks.

♦ There shall be no minimum marks for Internal Assessment.

Classification of successful candidates: Gradation of results shall be as per the University regulations.

♦ INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

Internal assessment shall include test, assignments. Students are to be evaluated for internal assessment as follows:

Two Tests – 10 marks, Two Assignments –10 marks,

♦ A candidate is allowed to carry all the previous un-cleared paper/s to the subsequent

semester/s.
